

Localisation Dashboard Overview

Project Background

- This dashboard has been developed as a collaboration between the Cox's Bazar Child Protection Sub-Sector (CPSS) and Street Child as a component of a 12-month 'Accelerating Progress Towards Localisation' Initiative supported by the CP-AoR

Methodology

- All organisations coordinating with the CPSS were invited to participate in a baseline survey in October 2020
- Participants for the baseline survey included: **8 Local/National NGOs, 1 Bangladesh Government Agency, 12 International NGOs and 3 UN Agencies**

Objectives

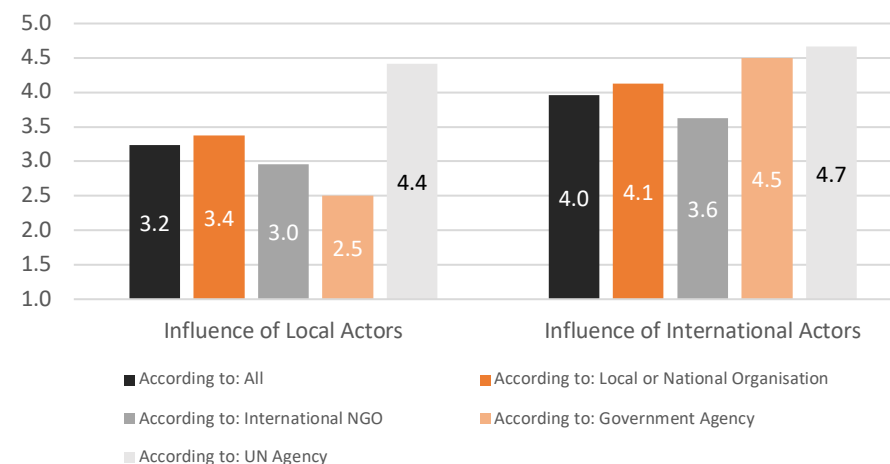
- This dashboard has been developed to track progress towards localisation – the extent to which local actors are participating meaningfully in the humanitarian planning process

Next Steps

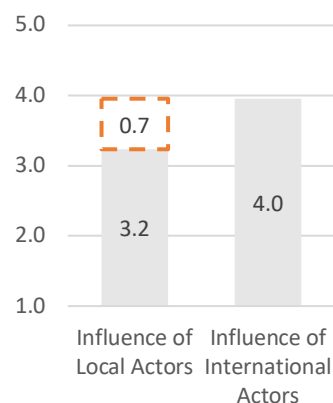
- Results will be used to facilitate open discussion amongst CPSS partners for how partners can take positive steps towards increasing meaningful participation of local actors

Influence of Different Actors According to...



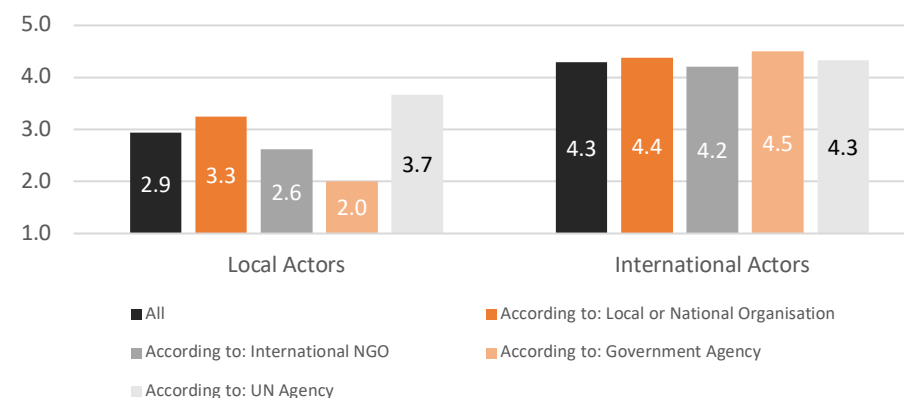
Influence Gap



Participation Gap

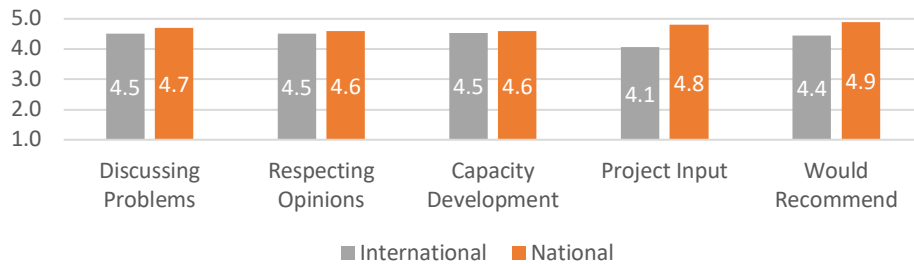

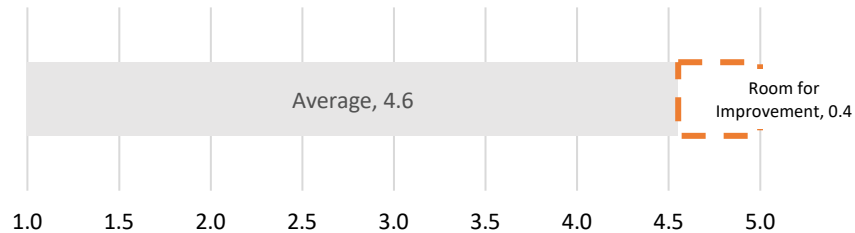

Quality of Partnerships – On a Scale of 1-5 across the sub-sector



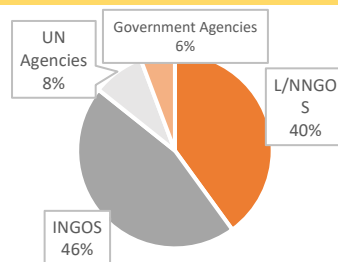

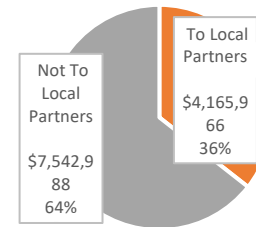

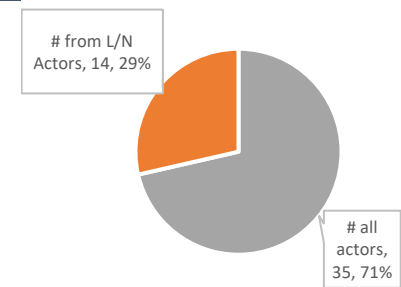

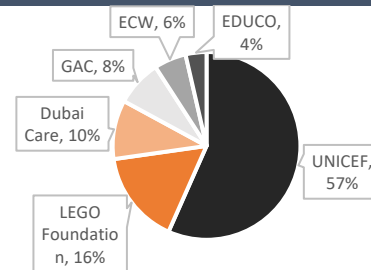
Funding to Local Partners



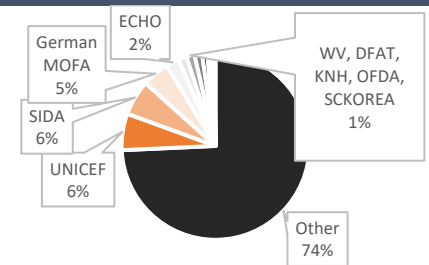

Funding Sources to Local Actors

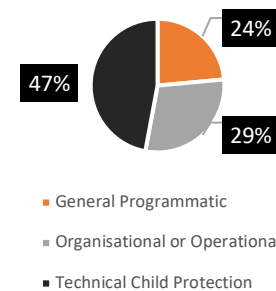


Funding Sources to International
