

ONLINE COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT: INTEGRATING GBV RISK MITIGATION INTO HUMANITARIAN ACTION

ANNEX: Overview of the 2023 online GBV Risk Mitigation online course

As outlined in the [course announcement](#), this course is divided into a series of topic-specific learning units that will equip participants with the knowledge and practical skills to integrate GBV risk mitigation into humanitarian action. This annex provides additional details on the flow of the course and the specific learning objectives of the GBV risk mitigation online course learning units.

Orange learning unit	Mandatory	Course orientation and overview of GBV risk mitigation	2 weeks: Offered 20 – 31 March 2023
Green learning unit	Optional*	Integrating GBV risk mitigation across the Humanitarian Program Cycle	10 weeks: Offered 31 March – 9 June 2023
Blue & Red learning units	Optional*	Integrating GBV risk mitigation in resource mobilization and advocacy	3 weeks: Offered 9 – 30 June 2023

*The Orange unit is the only mandatory unit, however, it **MUST** be paired with at least one of the other units. **It is not possible to take the Orange unit as a standalone.** If your application to this course is successful, you must enroll in the Orange unit **AND** *at least one other learning unit.*

Please note there is also a **Purple** learning unit which focuses on how non-GBV specialized actors can safely and appropriately respond to a GBV disclosure. This unit will be offered later in 2023 (additional details are forthcoming). Participants who have taken the orange learning unit in March 2023 will not need to repeat the unit prior to enrolling in the purple unit.

Orange learning unit objectives

Course orientation and overview of GBV risk mitigation (mandatory)

1. Build connections and network with other course participants;
2. Learn how to use the online course platform, Eduflow.
3. Develop a general understanding of GBV in emergencies, and of GBV risk mitigation specifically;
4. Understand the differences between GBV prevention, risk mitigation and response; the roles and responsibilities of different actors related to each; and how and why these differences manifest in programming.

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Green learning unit objectives

Integrating GBV risk mitigation across the Humanitarian Programme Cycle (optional)

1. Understand how to identify GBV risks within sector programming;
2. Identify entry points for GBV risk mitigation interventions;
3. Learn strategies to effectively mitigate GBV risks within sector programs to improve outcomes;
4. Engage meaningfully with women, girl, and other at-risk groups to reduce risk and improve safety; and
5. Understand and learn to apply principles of safe and ethical data collection, information sharing and analysis of GBV risks to improve programming.

Blue learning unit objectives

Integrating GBV risk mitigation in resource mobilization (optional)

1. Understand why and how to integrate GBV risk identification and mitigation measures in each element of a proposal, including focus on donor-specific GBV risk mitigation requirements and how GBV risk mitigation is noted in specific donor guidelines;
2. Build a solid understanding of GBV risk mitigation budgeting/staffing needs and rationales.

Red learning unit objectives

GBV risk mitigation advocacy (optional)

1. Understand the importance of advocacy for GBV risk mitigation;
2. Learn how to develop core GBV risk mitigation messages for advocacy;
3. Understand how various policy frameworks (specifically Call to Action and the GBV Accountability Framework) can be used to support advocacy for GBV risk mitigation;
4. Be able to effectively advocate for GBV risk mitigation with various partners, including donors, CO and sector leadership, even in the face of skepticism.

NOTE: the blue and red learning units will be combined for the 2023 course offering.
